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HISTORY OF COLLEGE

Government Arts College for women (A), started in the year 1969, has been functioning as an excellent model educational institution for women in Pudukkottai. It was started as the first Government Women's College in Pudukkottai district by the tireless efforts of the Government of Tamil Nadu and the people of Pudukkottai. The history of this college clearly shows its growth. The college is functioning with the objectives of self-reliance, charity and discipline.

Until 1968, H.H. Rajah's College, where his Majesty stayed, reserved one hundred seats for girls in the junior class. As the demand for women's education increased, a college organizing committee was formed under the patronage of Pudukkottai . Mr. Sathappa Subramanian, former MP Mr. K. Veeraiya. Dr. V.K. Ramachandran and Mrs Damayanthi Balakrishnan. The group, which has as its members, collected a donation of Rs.5 lakhs from new donors and people interested in educational development. The then Hindu Charitable and Agriculture Minister Mr. K.V. Subbiah was instrumental in getting this fund. The Pudukkottai Municipality provided a building named Vijayaragunathasathanam for the temporary functioning of the college.

As a result of these efforts, the college started functioning and 21 acres and 69 cents of land was acquired from the Tamil Nadu government for the college buildings as per Government order dated 9.7.1969 (No. 987). The foundation stone of the college building was laid on 31.7.1969 by the then Governor of Tamil Nadu Hon'ble Sardar Ujjal Singh.

The college shifted to a new campus in the academic year 1972-73. The opening ceremony was held on 4.9.1972 under the leadership of the then Minister of Education Hon'ble Dr. Nedunchezhian.

Since 1969, the college has been affiliated with the University of Madras. Under graduate (Mathematics) was started in 1972. Since 1982- 83, this college has been brought under the jurisdiction of Bharathidasan University. It was granted the first Autonomous status in the year November 2004 and has been working well since it got autonomous status. In March 2011 Re-evaluation by National Committee for Standardization and Evaluation was done and

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Grade B with 2.85 out of 4 was awarded. In 2017 National Standardization and Evaluation on 21st and 22nd August of the year Re-evaluated by the panel and graded B++ with a total grade of 2.76 out of 4 Awarded.

As per the Letter from the Director of College Education, Chennai 06 R.C.No.33440/Q 2/2021-2 dated 11.04.2022 (Stand.No : 40 / Higher Education (G1) Department Dated 11.04.22 our College name has been changed as Kalaignar Karunanidhi Government College of Arts for Women (A) Pudukkottai - 622 001.

In UG courses Part-I Tamil, Part-II English and Part-III, Main and Two allied courses are offered . Three papers in part-IV Major Elective, Two Papers in Non-Major Elective, Three Skill Based papers are offered. In Part V Extension Activities and Gender Studies are offered.

AUTONOMY AND CBCS SYLLABI:

Our College received the status of Autonomy in November 2004 and since then its function is appreciable. We revise the syllabi (both theory and practical) every three to four years as per the recommendation of the Board of studies and as per the norms and demands of UGC. Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) is included in the Semester Examination Marksheet. The syllabus is based on choice-based credit system (CBCS) since 2005-06 Academic Year as per norms of Bharathidasan University. The total credit for UG Degree courses in 180 credits and for the PG Courses it is 90 credits. The Internal and External and mark ratio is 25:75. Various committees which functions as a part of Autonomy are as follows:

- Governing Body
- Academic Council
- Planning and Evaluation
- Examination Committee

Controller of Examinations and Assistant Controller of Examinations jointly coordinate the Exam related duties.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES OF OUR COLLEGE:

<u>1. National Service Scheme</u>

Three Country Welfare Program Units in the College were started in 1976, 1984 and 1994 respectively and are functioning in three divisions under three Program Officers. 100 students will be selected in each category. These students must participate in welfare programs for 120 hours and 10 days in a special camp in an academic year without fail. Special privilege is given to the students who have got National Welfare Scheme certificate to join the jobs.

2. Youth Red Cross

A Lecturer in the Youth Red Cross Unit of the College Working as Project Officer and having 200 students as members in disaster management, fire prevention and rescue operations The main activities of this association are imparting trainings and encouraging blood donation.

3. Youth Development Service

The system works with a lecturer as the project officer. This organization is among the younger generation of students .It promotes service mindedness and leadership qualities.

4. Red Ribbon Club

The group is headed by an in-charge teacher whose primary mission is to create AIDS awareness among students.

5. Parent-Teachers' Association

Parent Teacher Association is the foremost among the sub-organizations that lend a helping hand to the development of the college. College Principal, Teachers and parents are members of this association. Membership fee is Rs. 10/- per annum Subscription Rs. 50/- as per Government is charged

6. Alumni Association

The Alumni Association is managed by the college principal, teachers and student representatives. All the female students who have completed their studies are members of this association. The graduation ceremony is conducted by this institute. Membership fee is Rs. 25/-

OTHER FACILITIES OF THE COLLEGE

1. Anti Ragging Committee

In our college, anti-bullying committee is functioning effectively with Principal, department heads, student council president and secretary, parent teacher association members and police members. Under Tamil Nadu Government Prohibition of Harassment Act 1997 section, two years imprisonment and a fine of Rs 10,000 will be imposed. Students cannot pursue any other degree course. Therefore, students are advised not to engage in plagiarism.

2. Social Service League

Provide examination fee for 10 poor students. The main tasks of this group are cleanliness and hygiene maintenance in the college campus. They also conduct competitions and prizes are given for Pudugai blind school children.

3. Computer Literacy Program

With the serious intention that all female students should acquire basic computer knowledge, the Tamil Nadu government introduced computer education training in all government colleges from 2000-01.

4. Soft Skill Center

The Soft Skill Center was started in our college in the academic year 2013-2014 and is functioning effectively with an in-charge.

5. Campus Interview

The committee consisting of the principal and two teachers invited the industrial companies to the college for direct employment of the students .This makes arrangements for conducting direct interviews with students.

Career orientation program

Along with Degree the students are provided with Job Opportunities in the Education Scheme from the Year 2008-2009. Out of which 30 qualified through entrance exam. First year students are admitted and given special training for placement. Through this training, students would prepare and appear for all kinds of competitive exams.

6. Career Guidance and Placement Cell

The group consists of the principal and two teachers. Counselling and training are provided for Higher education. Various entrance examinations are conducted and Placements are given to female students.

7. EK Bharat Shareshtna Bharat (EBSB)

Ore Bharatham Unnatha Bharatham organization is functioning well since June 2020 at Kalaignar Karunanidhi Government Arts College for Women (Autonomous) Pudukkottai. Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat programme aims to enhance interaction & promote mutual understanding between people of different states/UTs through the concept of state/UT pairing. The states carry out activities to promote a sustained and structured cultural connect in the areas of language learning, culture, traditions & music, tourism & cuisine, sports and sharing of best practices, etc.

8. Mental Health Club

The mental health Club of our college has been started in the year 2020 by our District Collector. Doctors from mental health department visit our college and provide counselling to the students and teachers. Corona Virus Awareness Programme was conducted and awareness was given to the students and teachers

Remedial Coaching to SC, ST & Minority Students

A special training program is conducted for Adi Dravidian tribal and minority students to prepare them for the competitive examination for employment since 2008-09.

The committee appoints one of its members as secretary. The committee gives suggestions to the principal for the development of the college.

Admission rules for students

1 .The admission of female students in various classes will be done every year as per the orders issued by the Government from time to time.

2 .The admission of each student is provisional and the admission of the student will be confirmed only after acceptance by the University. If not accepted by the university or institute of higher education, the student's name will be removed from the college. The amount paid by the student while joining the college will not be refunded. Due to this, the college will not be responsible for any financial loss or loss of student's opportunities.

Identity Card

Identity cards will be issued to all students admitted to this college. Students should bring their identity card to the college every day.

Transfer certificate

1. Students should apply for transfer certificate and conduct certificate in the prescribed form.

2. Absenteeism of students in all departments of public library, no dues certificate should be obtained.

3. If a student withdraws from the college in the middle of a semester, the student will not be able to get the amount paid by her.

4. A transfer certificate and conduct certificate will be issued to a student only if she pays all the fees along with the penalty fee during the academic year or within one year of withdrawal from the college. If you apply after one year, you will have to pay an acceptance fee of Rs.6/- to get both the certificates. To get a duplicate certificate, one should get a certificate from any one of the Police / District Attorney / Notary Public and pay Rs.8/- to get this certificate.

Students who leave the college at the end of one year will be issued with a one year certificate if their discipline and conduct is satisfactory to the principal and attendance is registered as per university rules.

Attendance Registration and Leave

1. A minimum of 90 working days for each semester shall be mandatory as per each semester selection.

2. Students who have attended the percentage decided by the University for each term will be admitted to the university examination.

3. Students who do not have sufficient attendance in a term to withdraw their course shall not be deemed to have completed.

4. According to the government regulations, only students who have 75% attendance, progress in studies and good conduct can get tuition fee concession.

5. With the recommendation of the Author-in-charge showing proper reasons in advance in the prescribed for Applying students cannot come to the college. Such students will not be allowed to absent themselves.

6. Parents or guardians of sick persons with proper medical certificate apply with signature.

7. After coming to the college, students are not allowed to leave the college without the permission of the Principal before the end of the classes. If you want to go out due to unavoidable reasons, you need to get the permission of the Principal in the appropriate form.

8. Students should attend college on time. For some reason, in case of lateness, enter the classroom only after obtaining permission from the Principal, they have to go.

9. Students will not be allowed any leave on the days of mid-sem examination, end-sem examination and model examination.

Laboratory exercises

- 1. If the students do not complete the practical laboratory exercises, they will not be allowed to appear for the practical examination conducted at the end of the year.
- 2. Pay adequate attention. Students also undergo regular laboratory practical training.
- 3. Students should use the practical training manuals decided by the Head of Departments.

Code of Ethics

Students must behave properly inside and outside of the campus to get the reputation of the college.

- 1. Every student should wear clean clothes.
- 2. They will see their teachers for the first time inside the college campus it is customary for students to salute.
- 3. Students should stand up when teachers enter the classroom and when they leave the class.

4. Teachers have their consent unless they cancel classes then the students have to go out.

5. Students should not walk in the corridors in front of the classroom during class time to disturb other classes.

6. If classes are not going on, students should go quietly to the library.

7. Go quietly from one classroom to another.

8. Students in any forum or group without the permission of the Principal should not be a member of any other affiliated organization. Do not engage in any activity that disrupts social harmony. Students participating in speech competitions and sports competitions, art programs etc. held outside the college must take prior written permission of the Principal. Any student who is found to be acting contrary to this rule will be suspended from the college immediately.

9. Student in the college campus and does not hold or participate in outdoor meetings without getting permission of the Principal.

10. Appropriate action will be taken against any student who makes a mistake. The decision of the College Principal is final.

11. All announcements will be announced to the students through notice board. Therefore, the notices pasted on the college notice board should be checked every day in the morning and evening. No statement shall be made in isolation. Failure to see the statements will not be accepted as a reason for not following the reference.

12. Students must park their two-wheelers and bicycles in their respective places in a row and in an orderly manner before the commencement of classes.

13. During the class hours, the student should not go to the office.

14. Physical test is conducted for first year students in first semester. Students must participate in this test.

15. Leave applications of students should not be sent directly to the Principal. It should be sent through their class in-charge.

16. Similarly, the students who wish to get train and bus fare concessions, conduct and no dues certificates should apply to the Principal through the appropriate Head of the Department.

17. Inside the college campus no one can write and not mark on the wall. Don't write on the desk and put dust on the classroom. If anyone misconduct they will be severely punished.

Note: A student who misbehaves will be punished by the Principal under the Government Education Regulations. Any of the following punishment may be imposed.

College examinations

1. The college exams are mid-semester, end-semester and model semester will be conducted for every semester.

2. Students who do not appear in the examination without proper reason will not be able to get proper evidence of their academic progress. And this information for parents will be informed.

College Annual Magazine

Annual magazine of the college is released once a year. Professors and students among the members selected by the principal of the college and the Principal as elected as chairman headed by The Editorial Board will run for the publication of this magazine.

College Library

1. Peace and order must be maintained inside the library.

2. The books of the public library will be provided to the students as per the following rules.

I. A student can take two books at a time.

II. A person who borrows a library book should not give the book to others. Any person who violates this rule will not be given any book for a period of one month.

III. Students are allowed to keep the books to be returned for a maximum of seven days. If the date of return of the books falls on a holiday, the next working day is allowed as the return date.

IV. A fine of 50 paisa per day for each book is to be paid if the book is not returned within the specified days. Students who do not pay the fine and return the book will not be allowed inside the library.

V. Students should check that the books are in proper condition while purchasing them from the library. The book may have pages torn, misplaced, or creased in the pages. If this is the case, it should be brought to the attention of the librarian. Otherwise the carrier is responsible for the defects.

VI. If the person who carries the book loses the book, she shall pay the corresponding fee along with fine as per the order if necessary.

VII. Teachers and non-teaching staff can borrow books from the library on all working days of the college.

Regarding Marksheet, Degree Certificate

Students who are leaving the college can get the mark sheet or the degree certificate from the college office by showing their identity card.

Physical education

1. All female students of the college are members of the Physical Education Council.

2. Only a coach approved by the principal will be allowed to coach students within the college campus.

3. Students participating in sports outside the college should take permission from the Principal. Violating students will be subject to disciplinary action.

4. The Secretary shall be responsible for the purchase and maintenance of the sports equipment, its proper delivery and return at the ground.
